

After the success of Agatha Christie's novel, the play version of *And Then There Were None* opened in the West End at the St James's Theatre on November 17, 1943, gained good reviews, and ran for 260 performances until February 24, 1944 when the theatre was bombed.

Not to be closed before its time, it was transferred to the Cambridge Theatre until the St James was restored, and it moved back to finish its run on July 1, 1944. Quite pleased with her efforts, Ms Christie declared it to be her best piece of "craftsmanship."

We like it, too! This is PG Players' second run of the show. We find it scary, intriguing, and great fun at Halloween! Thanks to a wonderful cast! And to our wonderful patrons, thanks for joining us!
